

Join us for our Travelers Club Meetings. You will partake in an enjoyable social outlet, catch up with friends and meet some new ones. Our enthusiastic and very experienced



Sugar & Spice Pecans

This recipe was submitted by Mindi Craig

3 Cups of Pecans 1 Cup of Sugar ¹/₃ Cup Water 1 Tbsp. Cinnamon ¹/₂ tsp. Salt 1¹/₂ tsp. Vanilla Extract

Directions: Preheat oven to 275°F. Lightly spray cookie sheet with non-stick spray. Place pecans on cookie sheet and bake for 10 minutes.

In a sauce pan, mix water, sugar, and salt and bring to a boil for 2 minutes. Remove sauce pan from stove and add vanilla, cinnamon, and pecans. Completely coat pecans in mixture and remove with a slotted spoon. Lay finished pecans on wax paper or aluminum foil to allow for cooling. Enjoy! •••
