Chicken Parmesan

2 Tbsp. butter

This is one of Susan Wright's favorite recipes. When Susan first moved away from home she could only cook a couple of things. This one was a big pleaser on date night if she was trying to impress. It is very easy but tastes like you've been cooking all day!

4 chicken breasts, skinned and boneless 1 large jar of RAGU garden vegetable pasta sauce ¾ cup of Italian bread crumbs 2 eggs, beaten 1 lb. mozzarella cheese sliced 1 large package of fresh sliced mushrooms Fresh garlic minced Parmesan cheese Salt Pepper

Sauté mushrooms and garlic in 2 tbsp. butter until brown. Set aside. Pound chicken breasts until about ½" thick and even. Season with salt and pepper. Dip the breast in the beaten egg and then in the bread crumbs, coating evenly. Brown in frying pan with olive oil. Season with garlic salt once brown. When browned on both sides, place in 13 x 9 roaster pan that has half of the RAGU sauce spread evenly in bottom. Layer sliced mozzarella cheese on top of browned chicken then spoon the rest of the pasta sauce over the top of the mozzarella until covered. Then spoon the mushrooms evenly over the top of each piece of chicken. Sprinkle all with generous amount of Parmesan cheese. Bake in 400°F oven approximately 20 to 25 minutes until cheese is melted. I always serve with angel hair pasta, a salad and fresh qarlic bread. A feast for a King!
